


## What is Ahotsak?

Ahotsak (Voices) was a movement that emerged in the 2000s, calling for a greater role for women in the search for solutions to the Basque conflict.

## Who participated in Ahotsak?

Women from across the political spectrum in the Basque Country and Navarre in Spain (except for the Popular Party and the Navarrese People's Union) and from the South of France/French Basque Country, as well as women of unions and feminist organizations.


## Evolution and type of actors




## Ahotsak's methodology and agreements

## Basic premises agreed by Ahotsak


